

Provisional Recommendations on Constituency Boundaries for the 2015 District Council Election

Central and Western District

(15 existing elected seats will remain unchanged)

Since the estimated population of each of the existing DCCAs in 2015 will not exceed the statutory permissible range, the EAC has made no proposal to adjust their boundaries.

Wan Chai District

(Due to adjustment of the district boundary, 2 DCCAs of the Eastern District will be transferred to the Wan Chai District. The number of elected seats for the Wan Chai District will therefore increase by 2 to 13 seats with effect from January 2016)

Since the estimated population of each of the existing DCCAs (including the 2 DCCAs to be transferred from the Eastern District to the Wan Chai District) in 2015 will not exceed the statutory permissible range, the EAC has made no proposal to adjust their boundaries.

Eastern District Constituency Boundaries Requiring Adjustments

(Due to adjustment of the district boundary, 2 DCCAs of the Eastern District will be transferred to the Wan Chai District. The number of elected seats will therefore decrease by 2 to 35 seats with effect from January 2016)
